Our pupils across the school have completed an audit linked to the wellbeing indicators and the results are published following the parent data.

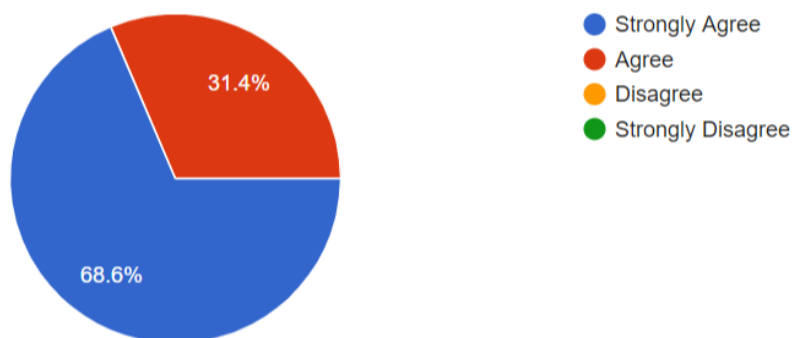
We appreciate it has been a tricky year for our staff, parents and pupils working through a second lockdown as well as under Covid restrictions whilst in school. Some of our families found this harder than lockdown 1. With this in mind, the results of our audit are particularly pleasing and we are delighted that our determination and focus to meet our young people's needs has been reflected in the responses.

The data compared to previous years remains largely consistent, with a small increase in "strongly agrees" in almost all questions. Many of the questions relate to our core work of learning and teaching and we are delighted that parents feel that we are getting this right for the children. This is our core business and our improvement plans show that an ongoing and consistent focus on learning and teaching is key to our success. Next session's improvement plan will continue to place a strong emphasis on this work.

The audit results and consultation on the areas for improvement next session will be discussed at our Parent Council meeting on 7th June. All parents are invited to attend and contribute.

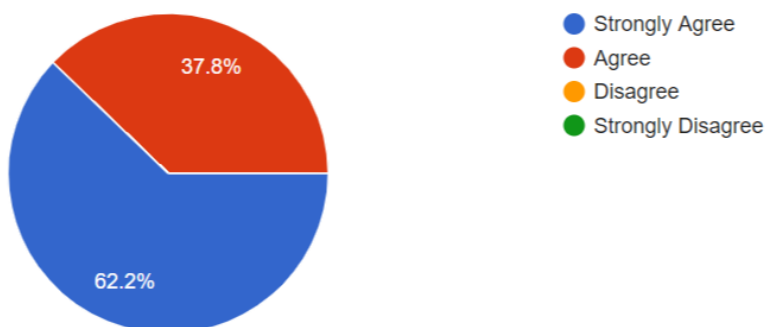
1. Staff treat my child fairly and with respect.

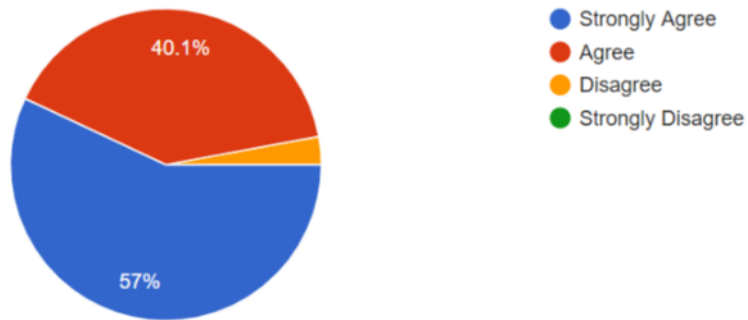
2. The school helps my child to feel confident.

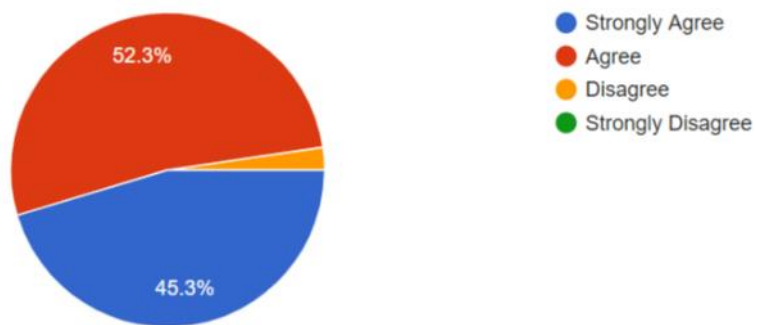
3. I feel staff really know my child as an individual.

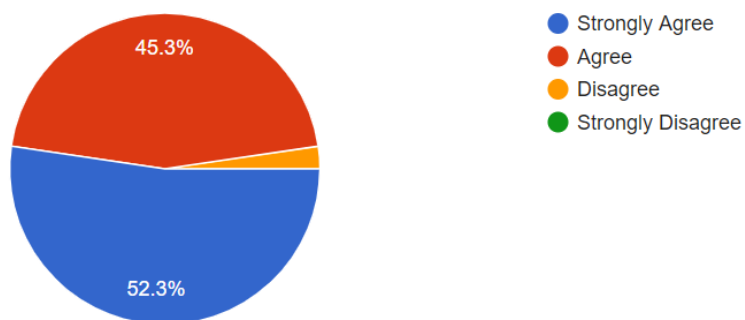
4. My child's learning is at the right level.

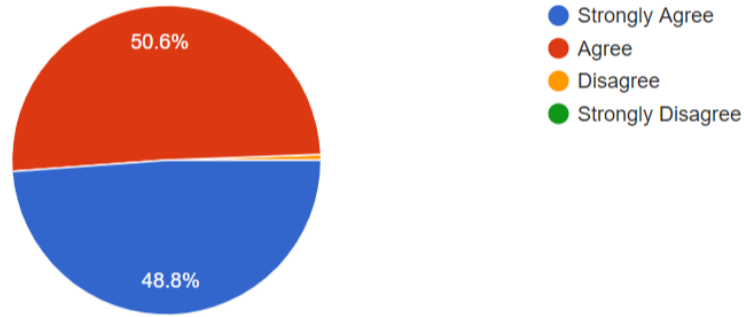
5. My child receives the help they need to do well.

6. The school supports my child's emotional well-being.

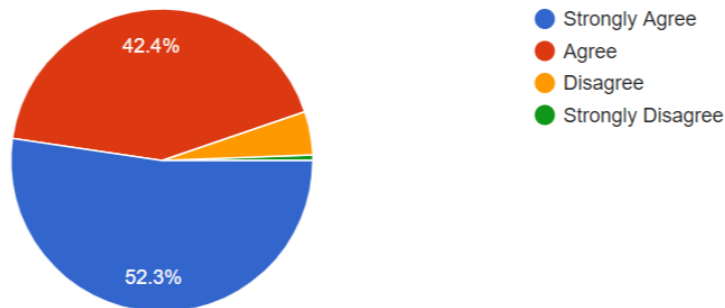

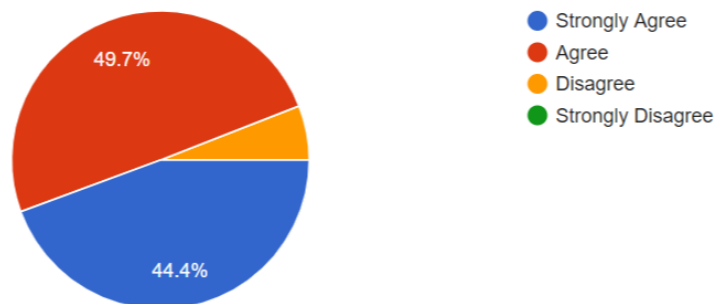
7. I have received helpful, regular feedback about how my child is learning and developing, e.g. informal feedback, parent meetings, Seesaw, Google Classroom and reports.

8. The school gives me advice on how to support my child's learning at home e.g. via Seesaw, phone calls, parents interviews, information on Google Classroom.

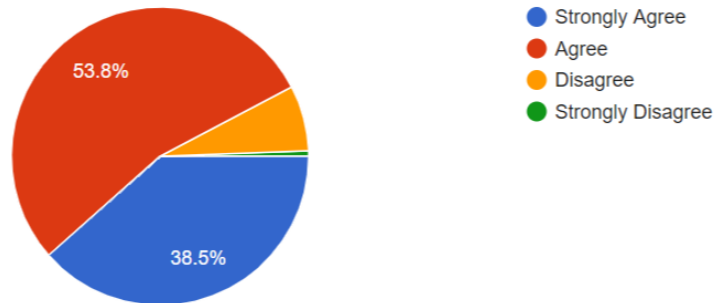

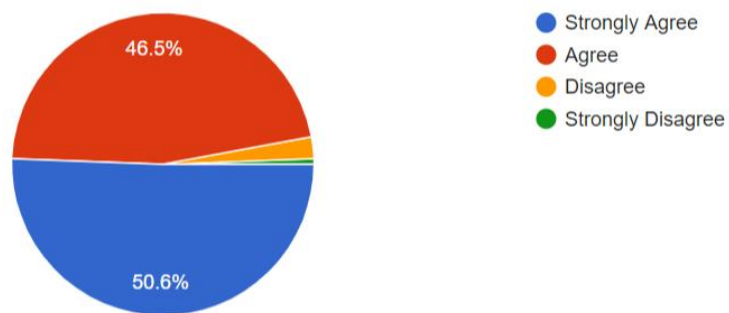
9. The school organises activities where my child and I can learn together e.g. virtually, home learning tasks, homework tasks.

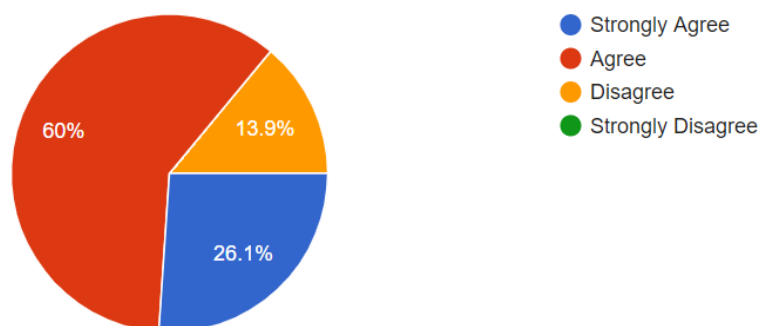
10. I feel comfortable approaching the school with questions, suggestions and/or a problem.

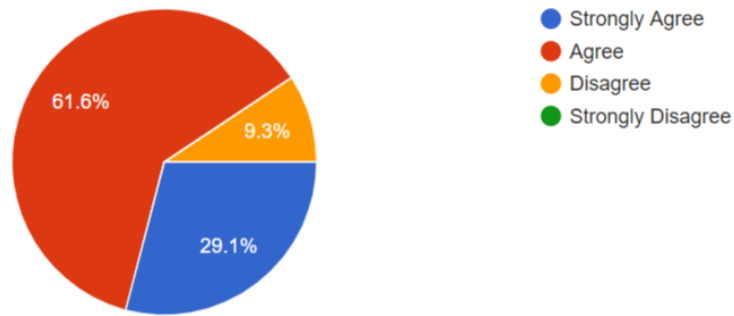
11. I feel encouraged to be involved in the work of the Parent Council and/or PTA

12. I am kept informed about the work of the PTA and Parent Council.

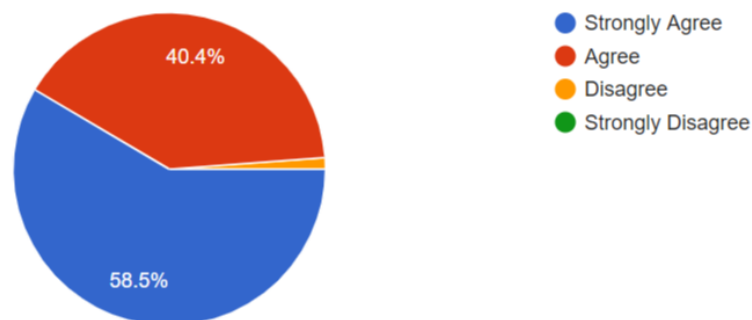

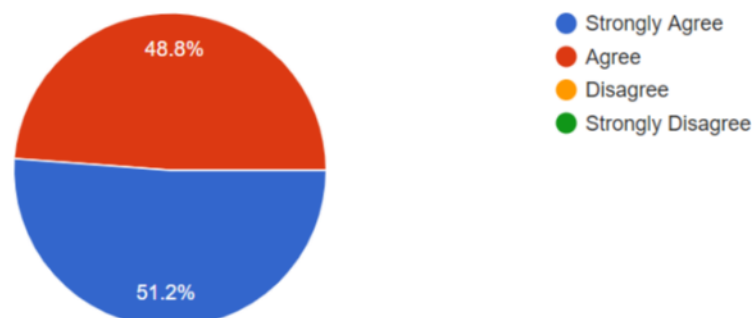
13. I am satisfied with the quality of the teaching in the school.

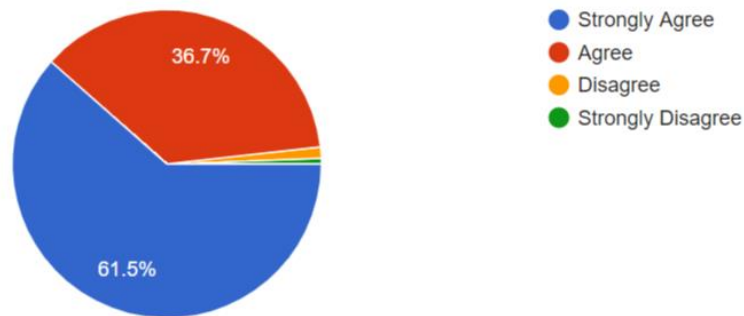
14. The school is well led and managed.

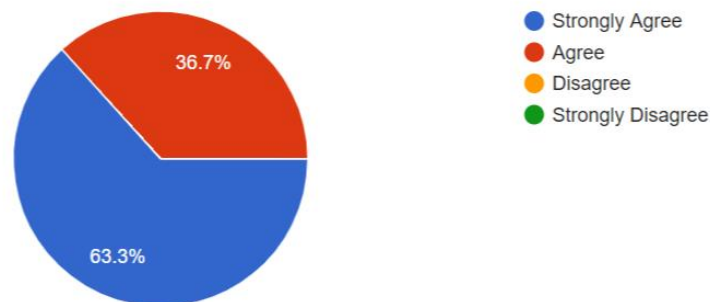
15. The school encourages children to treat others with respect.

Our pupils across the school have also completed an audit linked to the wellbeing indicators. The results are consistently very good across all indicators, with a strength being pupils feeling supported to achieve. The questions which ask pupils about their relationships with other pupils score slightly lower than other indicators; however as all results sit within 4 stars or above this is still pleasing. A community focus on relationships will be part of our development work next session.
